

## MONTHLY PA ANNOUNCEMENTS - PERSEVERANCE

The following is an example you can use or you can make up your own. It's very important to do this at least once a month and it has the greatest impact if delivered by the Principal or Vice Principal.

### FOR VIDEO 1

**PERSEVERANCE** is this month's superpower... it's a pretty big word that simply means you don't quit and you don't give up, you stick with whatever you're doing until you're finished or until you've reached your goal! That's the power of **PERSEVERANCE**!

You might think it's impossible but with **PERSEVERANCE**, anything is possible as long as you work hard and keep going until you finish your goal. With **PERSEVERANCE** you will be able accomplish whatever you set your mind on.

So keep your eyes and ears open for those students who are dedicated to finishing tasks and assignments, no matter how difficult they are, and then give them your vote. You'll be glad you did and you'll feel good too.
